

ARP FUNDING PROPOSAL

ERIE POLICE DEPARTMENT



Reinstate officers specially-trained to deal with crisis situations:

- Add 9 officers
- 2-officer Crisis Car, working 24/7
- Work with homeless population and deal with issues in Downtown Erie
- Work with SafeNet on domestic dispute calls
- Work with social service and mental health partners when responding to calls with mental health issues/transports



Reinstate specially-trained detectives to work directly with the juvenile justice system:

- Add 6 detectives
- Work with school police/juvenile probation on minor crimes to get youth into juvenile diversion programs
- 15 years without juvenile detectives has resulted in an increase in shootings and gang activity
- Detectives will also assist with unassigned criminal cases



Add additional officers to work high crime hours (8 p.m. to 4 a.m.) and increase community outreach efforts:

- Add 4 officers to the Neighborhood Action Team (NAT), which has lost 5 officers since 2015
- NAT would attend neighborhood watch meetings and focus on drug activity & gang/gun violence
- Hire 2 PAL/COP officers for full-time community outreach, recruitment, and trust-building initatives



Outfit additional officers and detectives with needed equpment and vehicles:

- \$3K to outfit each officer (\$63K total)
- \$1K for taser and gun (\$21K total)
- 1 crisis car police interceptor with Axon dash cam (\$65K total)
- 3 cars for detectives (\$75K total)
- 3 cars for capacity building (\$195K)







across 13 Task Forces and the PAL and COP programs, in addition to their regular duties.

In 2005, due to budget cuts, **40 officers were cut**, including the Juvenile Unit and Crisis Car.
